

CITY OF GROVE CITY, OHIO COUNCIL MINUTES

March 01, 1999

Regular Meeting

The regular meeting of Council was called to order by President Milovich at 8:00 p.m. in the Council Chamber, City Hall, 4035 Broadway.

After a moment of silent prayer and the Pledge of Allegiance, roll was called and the following members were present:

1. Mr. Bennett moved to excuse Mr. Eversman; seconded by Mr. Radi.

2. President Milovich recognized Mayor Grossman for several presentations. Mayor Grossman presented Mr. Dick Furr, volunteer for Emergency Fund, with a check for \$3,228.44 from the From Our Hearts Campaign. Mr. Furr expressed his gratitude for what the community does. He said we deserve to feel very proud. Mayor Grossman also recognized Dr. Berger who was very supportive of this year's campaign - supplying a dancer and having a Patient Appreciation Day with the proceeds going to the Campaign. She presented the Lions Club with a Proclamation for Pilot Dogs Week; and administered the Oath of Office to John Matera for the Civil Service Commission.

3. Mr. Radi moved to dispense with the reading of the minutes for the previous meeting and approve as written; seconded by Mr. Fulton.

3. President Milovich read the agenda items and they were approved by unanimous consent.

The Chair recognized Mr. Bennett, Chairman the Lands Committee, for discussion and voting of legislative agenda items under said committee.

1. Ordinance C-8-99 (Accept the annexation of 0.974 acres, located east of Borror Road and north of State Route 665, to the City of Grove City) was given its first reading. Second reading and public hearing will be held on March 15, 1999.
2. Ordinance C-9-99 (Approve a PUD-I Zoning Classification for 231.783 acres located on the north side of S.R. 665 and west of I-71, upon its annexation to the City of Grove City) was given its first reading. Second reading and public hearing will be held on April 05, 1999.

The Chair recognized Mr. Fulton, Chairman the Service Committee, for discussion and voting of legislative agenda items under said committee.

1. Resolution CR-13-99 (Authorize the Mayor to enter into an Agreement with the Ohio Tuition Trust Authority, which will offer the Ohio Prepaid Tuition Program to City Employees) was given its reading and public hearing.

Mayor Grossman explained that the City has approximately 140 employees and some of them have taken advantage of the Ohio Tuition Trust College Credits and she would like to offer payroll deduction for this program.

There being no additional questions or comments, Mr. Fulton moved it be approved; seconded by President Milovich.

The Chair recognized Mr. Radi, in the absence of Mr. Eversman, Chairman the Finance Committee, for discussion and voting of legislative agenda items under said committee.

1. Ordinance C-7-99 (Appropriate \$1,731.00 from the Street Fund for the Current Expense of Property Damage) was given its second reading and public hearing.

Mr. Radi explained that the City has received money from an Insurance Company for damaged property and this appropriation will go toward the repair of said property.

In closing, the Mayor announced that the State of the City address was given at the Chamber's first Quarterly Luncheon last week. She thanked Council and the Administrative Staff for their contributions to this very unique City. She also thanked Mr. Matera for his volunteerism and noted that the Gardens at Gantz are featured in this month's edition of Ohio Magazine.

2. Mr. Kohman, City's Consulting Engineer, commented that the initial engineering study for the West Park Street Area is complete and was provided to Council this evening. Their findings, essentially, boil down to requiring an additional retention basin. They will be working with Council to take the alternatives presented and come up with a final plan. He indicated that there were a few extra copies of the report available for those interested.
3. Mr. Radi thanked Mr. Kohman for such a comprehensive and professional report. He commented that some additional study on the sanitary sewer will take place in the spring and asked Nelson to explain. Mr. Kohman stated that they will be placing camera's in the lines to inspect their quality, look for blockages, etc. This will happen when the weather warms up.
3. After additional comments from Administration, the Chamber and Council, a motion was made to adjourn and seconded. Motion carried.
