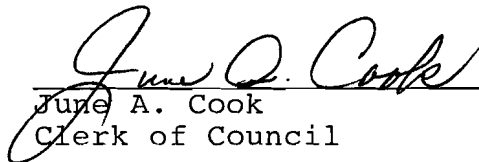
15. Resolution No. CR-68-90 (Object to liquor permit) was given its reading and Mr. Buckley moved it be approved; seconded by Mr. Mountain.
